**Annual Meeting - Report on IQAC Vision 2025: Reflect, Review, Refine**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur, convened a special gathering titled **"IQAC Vision 2025: Reflect, Refine, Renew"** on 05 August 2025 from 2:30 PM to 4:30 PM. The session was held under the esteemed guidance of the Rev. Fr. Julious Arakkal CMI (Director), Rev. Fr. Deljo Puthoor CMI (Joint Director), Rev. Fr. Antony Perinchery CMI (Joint Director), Rev. Fr. Antony Mannumel CMI (Associate Director), Dr. Betsy Thomas (Principal & IQAC Chairman), and the IQAC Members. 63 members were present.

The meeting began with a Welcome Address by Dr. Betsy Thomas, Principal & IQAC Chairman, highlighted the importance of aligning academic and administrative processes with national and international quality benchmarks, while also acknowledging the collective contributions of faculty, staff, and students in nurturing a culture of quality at Amala.



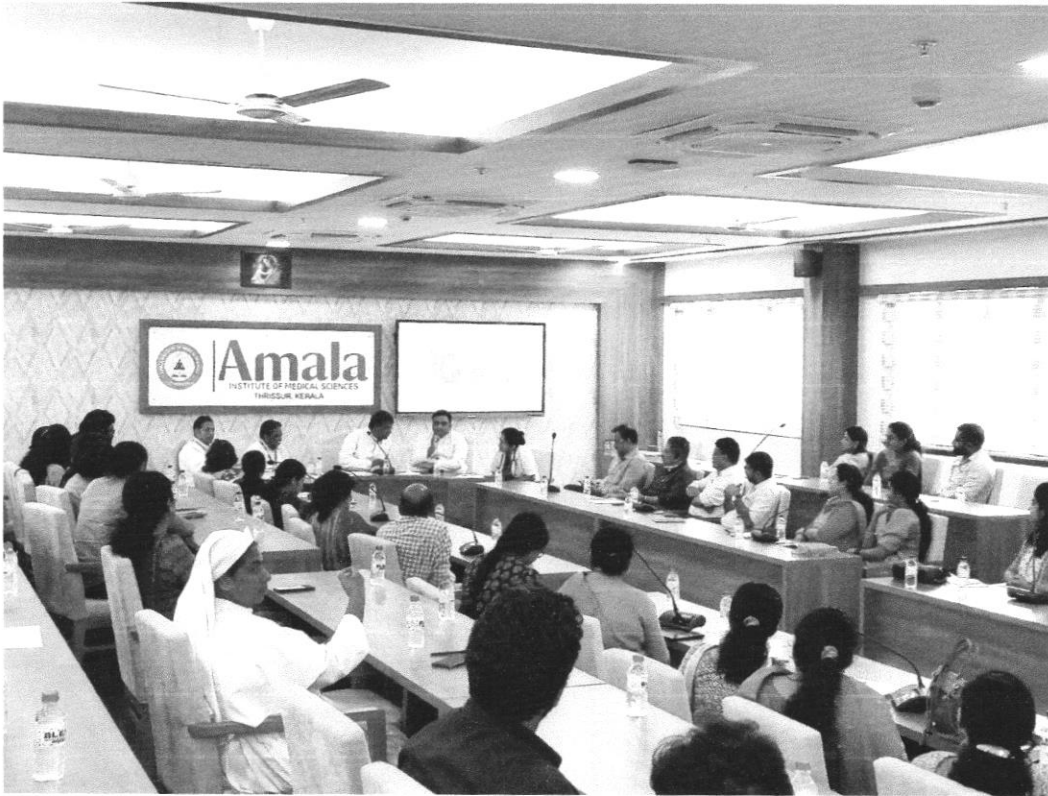

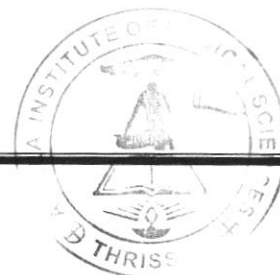
