Proceedings of the meeting:


The meeting began with a silent prayer at 02.30 PM. Dr.V K Prathibha welcomed all the committee members. She invited Dr. Boney Rajan to present the ADR reports. He presented the report of ADRs received in the Pharmacovigilance centre from January to April 2025.


A total of 131 adverse drug reactions were reported from January to April 2025. The number of ADR reports received was significantly less when compared with the previous month.. The number of ADRs reported from October to December 2024 was 165. He also mentioned that spontaneous reporting can be increased with the active participation of all healthcare professionals. He also presented the drug-wise ADR reports and it was emphasized that the main group of drugs causing reactions were parenteral antibiotics (84). Among the parenteral antibiotics-related ADRs, 77 were test dose reactions.

He also mentioned that in the department wise reporting departments like General Medicine, Emergency Medicine, have increased their reporting. He added that all clinical departments have started reporting the ADRs. General medicine ranked the first position for reporting highest number of ADRs. He also enlisted some of the significant and rare ADRs which were reported from various departments. In addition, Dr.Boney Rajan presented the monthly drug alerts issued by the Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC). He explained the National Medical Commission (NMC) Accreditation criteria and presented the draft standard operating procedure for the same. He pointed out that enhancing patient education could lead to improved level of NMC Accreditation. He concluded his presentation by inviting suggestions from the committee members, with a particular focus on meeting the NMC Accreditation standards.

Fr. Delo discussed the importance of promoting ADR reporting awareness among patients. Sr.Likhitha mentioned that a copy of patient education is already maintained in the nursing record of every patient case file. Dr. Lejo added that patient education is provided by both the Pharmacy and Clinical Pharmacy departments Fr. Jaison inquired about the possibilities for publication and research. Dr. Prathibha shared details on the progress of ongoing research. Dr.Boney Rajan added that any rare case reports or case series could be considered for publication. Dr. Prathibha raised the issue of reconstituting the Pharmacovigilance Committee, which was approved by Fr. Deljo. She also expressed concern over the increasing number of test dose-related ADRs. The committee discussed the necessity of administering test doses. Dr. Rajesh Anto highlighted the legal benefits of such practices.

Dr.Prathibha thanked all the members for participating in the meeting, which concluded at 03:00 PM.

Proceedings of the meeting:

The meeting began with a silent prayer at 3.PM. Dr. Laween welcomed all the committee members. Dr. Sreekala Jayan presented the ADRs received in the Pharmacovigilance centre from September to November 2025.

A total of 195 adverse drug reactions were reported from September to November 2025. The number of ADR reports received was greater than when compared with the previous period. The number of ADRs reported from June - August was 154. She also mentioned increase in both active and spontaneous reporting. She also presented the drug-wise ADR reports and it was emphasized that the

main group of drugs causing reactions were parenteral antibiotics (60). Among the parenteral antibiotics-related ADRs, 56 were test dose reactions.


She also mentioned that in the department wise reporting departments like General Medicine, General Surgery, Emergency Medicine have increased their reporting. She added that all clinical departments have started reporting the ADRs. General medicine ranked the first position for reporting highest number of ADRs. She also enlisted some of the significant and rare ADRs which were reported from various departments. She presented the details of ADRs associated with high-alert medications. In addition, Dr.Sreekala Jayan presented the monthly drug alerts issued by the Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC). She presented an overview of the Pharmacovigilance activities conducted during the reporting period.

Dr. Prathibha also expressed concern over the increasing number of test dose-related ADRs. The committee discussed the necessity of administering test doses. Dr. Rajesh Anto highlighted the legal benefits of such practices.


