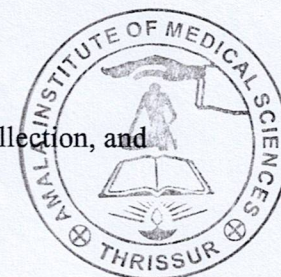
Report on Community Medicine awareness programme:

A **UG Research Workshop** was conducted for the 2022 batch of undergraduate medical students on **May 28, 2025**, at **Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur**. The session was organized as part of the ongoing efforts of the **Department of Community Medicine** to inculcate research aptitude and scientific thinking among future medical professionals.

The workshop was facilitated by **Dr. Jose Vincent**, Associate Professor, from the Department of Community Medicine. A total of **100 undergraduate students** actively participated in the programme.

The session included the following key components:

- Introduction to medical research and its relevance in clinical practice
- Fundamentals of research methodology, including study design, data collection, and analysis
- Introduction to literature review and referencing tools
- Ethics in medical research and the importance of obtaining approvals
- Group-based interactive activities and problem-solving exercises



The workshop also highlighted the **importance of evidence-based practice** and aimed to equip students with the **skills required to conceptualize and carry out small-scale research projects** under faculty mentorship.

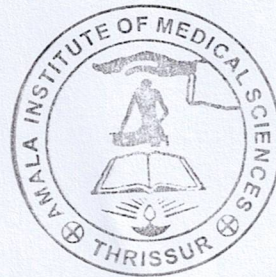
The participants showed great enthusiasm and interacted actively during the sessions. Feedback from students reflected the usefulness and clarity of the topics discussed.

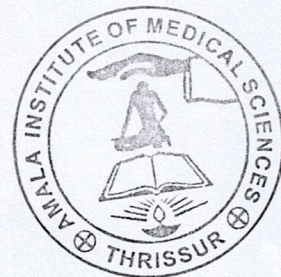
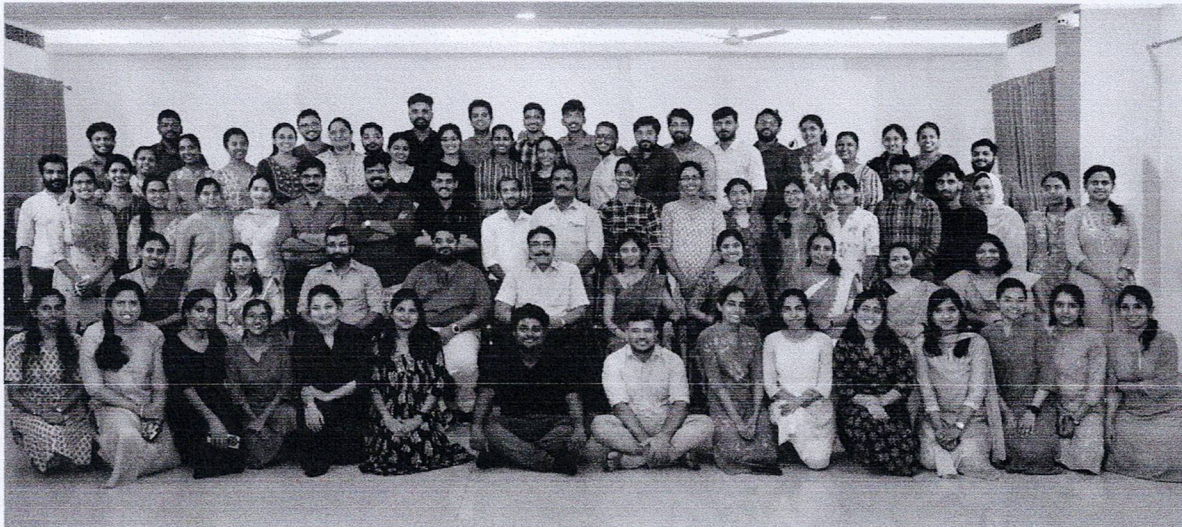

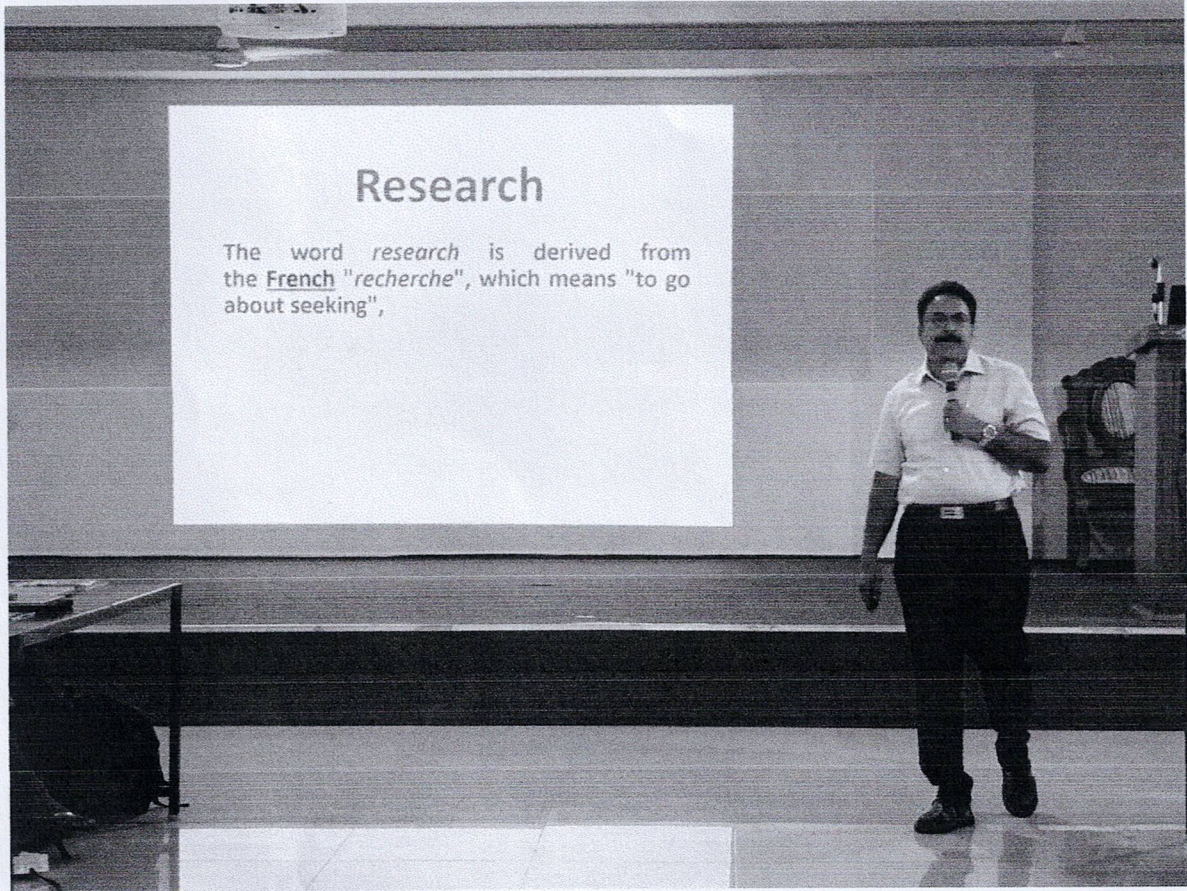
